- Students have unique login details to www.unifrog.org, which contains information on an extensive variety of careers including: videos with people in the careers talking about what they do; job descriptions; qualifications; possible pathways into the careers. Unifrog also highlights different Colleges and Universities all around the world and includes quizzes that help identify careers that link to interests and subjects enjoyed at school.
- Information is shared with students through their Bromcom app. Under the banner of 'Careers Notice', this is not homework, but allows students to access at any time.

How is careers taught at Marshland High School?

- In years 7 through to 9, students complete fortnightly Character and Culture lessons. With a focus on employability skills, as well as introducing a career of the fortnight, students have the option to independently research should they be interested finding out more.
- All year groups have one term dedicated to careers during Tutor time. This is age appropriate and prepares students for the key phases within education. For example, Year 11 prepare for transition to post-GCSE courses while Year 9 prepare for their GCSE Options.
- Assemblies from different companies and education providers are a regular feature across year groups. Year 10 students Super Learning Day includes workshops on labour market information, apprenticeships, supported by a range of companies.

What activities support students with careers at Marshland High School?

- Throughout their time at Marshland, students have subject specific opportunities, such as a trip to watch a court case; Anglia Water STEM activity and many more.
- In Key Stage 3, workshops take place with Jon Egging Trust, the RAF and UEA Outreach team to develop important skills for the future.
- We hold a biannual careers fair. Year 9 & 10 students have the opportunity to attend during the day. Year 10 & 11 students are invited after school with their parents.
- Year 10 students have the opportunity to:
 - Attend a sixth form or college taster day
 - Take part in a mock interview delivered by companies that support the school
 - Prepare CV's and covering letters to apply for a work experience placement.
 - Attend a one-week work experience.
- During Year 10 or 11 students have a meeting with an independent careers advisor.
- In Year 11 students visit a University.
- Year 11 students wishing to apply for apprenticeships have an opportunity for 1:1 support.
