## Year 9

During Year 9 students complete a unit designed to develop students' History skills. They start their GCSE Edexcel course in the second half of the autumn term.

### Autumn Term

How significant was the Russian Revolution? Crime and Punishment through time c.1000- c.1500

**Spring Term** Crime and Punishment through time c.1500-c.1700 Crime and Punishment through time c. 17000-c.1900

#### Summer Term

Crime and Punishment c. 1900-present Whitechapel 1870–c1900

Year 10 During Year 10 students study the following units:

Spring Term Anglo-Saxon and Norman England 1066-87 Norman England 1066-88

#### Summer Term

The early settlement of the American west c1835–c1862 Development of the Plains c.1862-1876

Year 11 During Year 11 students study the following units:

<u>Autumn Term</u> Conflicts and conquest of the American West c. 1876-c.1895 The Weimar Republic 1918-29

<u>Spring Term</u> Hitler's rise to power, 1919-33 Nazi control and dictatorship, 1933-39

<u>Summer Term</u> Life in Nazi Germany, 1933-39 Revision



#### <u>Assessment</u>

Regular Assessments take place at the end of units of work, students are expected to revise for these as part of their homework.

#### <u>Trips</u>

All Year 9 and 10 students are invited to the Nottingham Galleries of Justice. Pupils will take part in three workshops on the day, which are likely to include:

- A tour of the Crime and Punishment museum, looking at how law has changed throughout time.
- A mock trial focusing on a case from history.
- A workshop looking at punishments.

Year 10 and 11 students are invited to attend a 3 day tour of Berlin. Sites visited will include:

- Sachsenhausen Concentration camp.
- Wannsee Villa.
- German History Museum.
- Holocaust memorial.
- Topography of terror.
- A visit to the Reichstag (German Parliament building).
