4/5	Vocabulary and language variety	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Learn why we have such a vast vocabulary in the English language</li> <li>• Consider what question should be asked when deciding which words to use</li> </ul>
11/5	Structure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Understand that the structure of a speech is like a journey</li> <li>• Employ a simple strategy to help plan a short speech</li> </ul>
18/5	Rhetorical techniques	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Learn what rhetorical devices are</li> <li>• Try to identify rhetorical techniques used by others</li> </ul>
1/6	Content	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Understand that planning the content of a speech is crucial</li> <li>• Consider audience/purpose when planning content</li> </ul>
8/6	Clarifying and summarising	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To learn the difference between summarising and clarifying</li> <li>• To recognise the difference in given examples and generate own examples</li> </ul>
15/6	Audience awareness	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To learn why knowing your audience is so important</li> <li>• How to plan to engage your audience</li> </ul>
22/6	Self-regulation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To understand what self-regulation is</li> <li>• To recognise why monitoring behaviours in communication is so important</li> </ul>
29/6	Listening and responding	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To understand the difference between listening and active listening</li> <li>• To consider when it is time to listen in conversation and when it is time to listen</li> </ul>
6/7	Confidence in speaking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To understand that to be good at something, you have to work hard for it</li> <li>• To accept feedback and amend speaking styles based on feedback</li> </ul>
13/7	Working with others	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Learn why speaking in turn is important</li> <li>• Consider the differences between speaking alone and with others.</li> </ul>
