Marshland is delighted to report another year of “best ever” results

Summary of Key Indicators

This year the government has implemented 4 new accountability measures for secondary schools, which are given in the table below:

Percentage achieving A* - C in both English and Maths	63%
Percentage achieving the EBacc (A*- C in Eng, Ma, 2 x Sci, Fr/Ger, & Hist/Geog)	18%
Attainment 8 grade (the ‘average grade’ achieved by students across 8 subjects)	C
Progress 8 score (a measure of how much progress students made)*	+0.3
(Progress 8 score for disadvantaged students	+0.1)

*The Progress 8 score is a measure of the progress students have made since the end of primary school. An ‘expected’ amount of progress (based on how much progress students nationally have made in recent years) is ‘added on’ to each students KS2 outcome to generate an expected average GCSE grade for them. This is then compared with what they actually achieved across 8 subjects, and the difference is their Progress 8 score. A positive progress 8 score therefore shows the student made more than expected progress and a negative score indicates they made less than expected progress. The school score is an average across all the students in the cohort. A school score of – 0.5 should trigger an Ofsted inspection (and possible Special Measures); a score of + 0.5 will ensure that Ofsted will not inspect that year!
