

2017 GCSE Results

Summary of Key Indicators

This year the government uses 4 accountability measures for secondary schools, which are given in the table below.

Progress 8 score (a measure of how much progress students made)*	+0.24	This is classed as above average and places the school in the top 30% in England.	

*The Progress 8 score is a measure of the progress students have made since the end of primary school. An 'expected' amount of progress (based on how much progress students nationally have made in recent years) is 'added on' to each student's KS2 outcome to generate an average GCSE grade for them. This is then compared with what they actually achieved across 8 subjects, and the difference is the Progress 8 score. A positive Progress 8 score therefore shows the student made more than expected progress and a negative score indicates they made less than expected progress. The school score is an average across all the students in the cohort. A school score of -0.5 should trigger an Ofsted inspection (and possible Special Measures); a score of +0.5 will ensure Ofsted will not inspect that year!

Trends

The government has recently added these measures so there is limited historical data.
