

YEAR 7 CATCH UP PREMIUM 2019

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve at 100 as a scaled score in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2).

All schools have to report on how this money was spent, as well as the impact of the premium to those pupils who are eligible.

We received £24,462 in 2018-2019 to support students who arrived at Marshland with a score of below 100 (secondary ready) in English and/or Maths. We put a range of interventions in place such as, Accelerated Reader and Catch up Numeracy to support these students. We also used the extra funding to create smaller class sizes for our bottom sets, so that these students could have more teacher time. The impact of these interventions is shown below.

English catch up

55 students below expected level in English on entry based on key stage 2 tests.

Impact

Reading and writing progress catch up

Reading

- 11 students achieved rapid progress in reading improving by 1+ year in 7 months.
- Average improvement or reading was + 4 months. This meant that students achieved an average reading age of 9 years 5 months
- With outliers removed the progress was + 10 months.
- On Accelerated Reader there was a scaled score improvement of + 46

Writing:

- Their raw score writing improved from 5.45 to 8.6
- This was an average improvement of 16% in total writing mark

Maths

61 students below expected level in Maths on entry based on key stage 2 tests.

- Printing budget for resources from White Rose Maths & Mathsbox - (£200)
- KS3 text books targeting low ability learners (£100)
- Learning mentor to complete form time intervention targeting year 7 students. (£536.80)
- Learning mentor to support in Phoenix group & A band maths lessons. (£2,039.84)
- Learning Mentor to run an open-house homework club in the maths department or support in the school homework club. (£2449.10)
