Our Year 11 students have been working exceptionally hard to complete subject assessments. The challenge that students currently face with their assessments is comparable to any normal examination year. Consequently, they should be rightly proud of their efforts this term and we are confident that this will be reflected within their GCSE outcomes. Year 11 will continue to work towards their Centre Assessed Grades (CAG's) up to and including the 18th June – their final day with us at Marshland. It is imperative therefore that they attend school every day.

Since return from lockdown, we have noticed that school attendance has still not recovered to levels seen prior to COVID. One of the greatest gifts we can give to any child is a high quality education. It is therefore imperative that your child attends school regularly and we ask for your support to ensure this happens. They should be aiming to have an attendance of no less than 96% over the academic year. Research evidence shows student achievement, progress and ultimately GCSE outcomes are typically lower where attendance drops below 96%.
