# Purpose of the Evening

# Setting

## July 2018

- ▶ KS2 raw scores in English and Maths used to initially set all pupils.

## September 2018

- ▶ Reading tests in English lessons. Results allow us to look more closely at the accuracy of the sets and discuss any anomalies.

## December 2018

- ▶ All pupils have completed nearly a full term of work and all subject areas submit a sub-level for each pupil. Reports will be issued to parents.
- ▶ We now use KS2 scores, Reading tests and subject sub-levels to review all the sets. It is inevitable that there may be changes.

## June 2019 and beyond

- ▶ Setting is reviewed after a full year of work and sets are altered for September 2019.

## How do we ensure your child is making the expected Level of Progress?

All Year 7 pupils will receive an aspiration target grade for every subject. Based upon their KS2 score

### Intervention

Using the Y7 target levels, Year 7 pupil progress is checked by Department leaders, House leaders, Pupil premium leader, SENDCo and Mrs Swinburn.

Any pupil we feel is not on track to meet their End of Year Target will receive tailored intervention to help them keep up.

Parents are informed about the support their child will receive and will also be encouraged to work at home with their child to compliment the extra support in school.

# How will I be informed about my child's progress in school?

- ▶ Every year there will be a parents Evening.
- ▶ We will report to you **three times** a year.
- ▶ Reports tell you how your child is progressing towards their targets
- ▶ Report (1) week beginning **13<sup>th</sup> December 2018.**
- ▶ Report (2) week beginning **3<sup>rd</sup> April 2019.**
- ▶ Report (3) week beginning **18<sup>th</sup> July 2019.**
- ▶ Parents Evening is on **Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> May 2019**

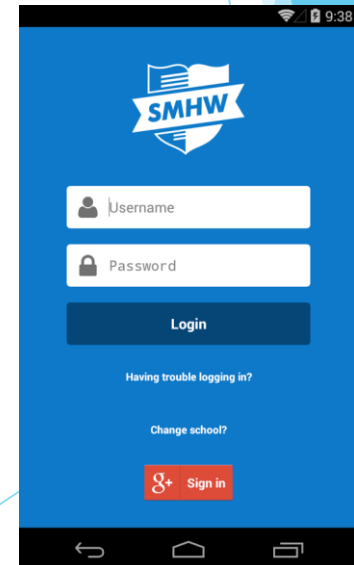
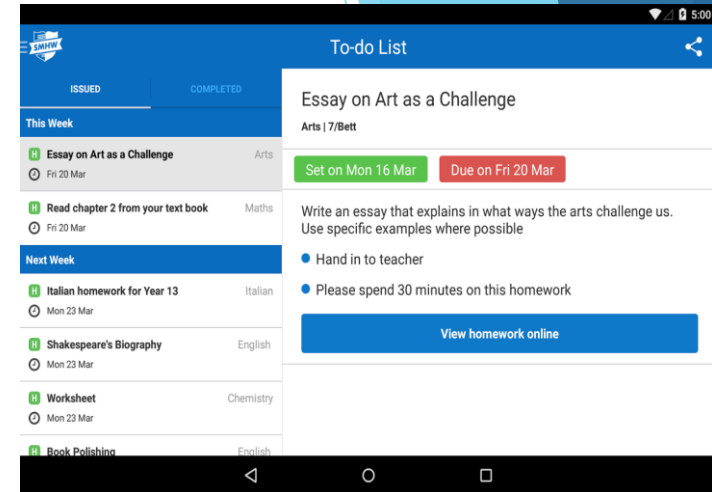
## Install the App

# Show My Homework

- ▶ A way to: Record, track and monitor homework at Marshland High School.
- ▶ Show My Homework, an online tool to help you keep track of your child's homework. Show My Homework will allow you to see the details of the tasks your child has been set, as well as its submission status and grades.
- ▶ You will be provided with login details to your personal account, ready-linked to your child's homework calendar.
- ▶ Simply visit Show My Homework by clicking the link on our website page to logon and view your child's live homework calendar.
- ▶ 24/7 access.
- ▶ View quality and quantity of homework.
- ▶ Translation into over 50 languages.
- ▶ Apps available for iPhone, iPad, iPod Touch, and Android devices.
- ▶ Receive automated notifications before homework is due.
- ▶ Show My Homework, will provide parents with a deeper insight into the homework your child receives. More importantly, we hope that it will improve your child's organisation, time-management, and help them to keep on top of their workload

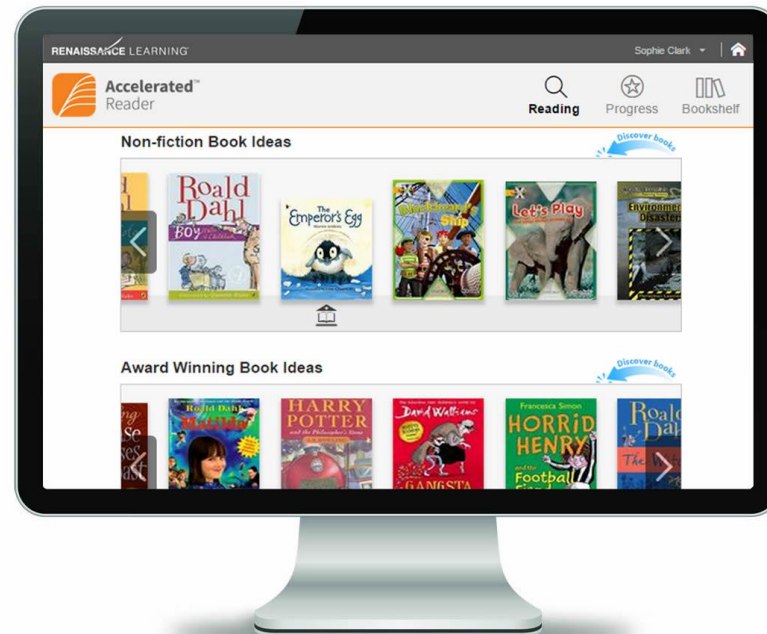

- ▶ Students will need to read 20-25 minutes a day which will be part of their English homework

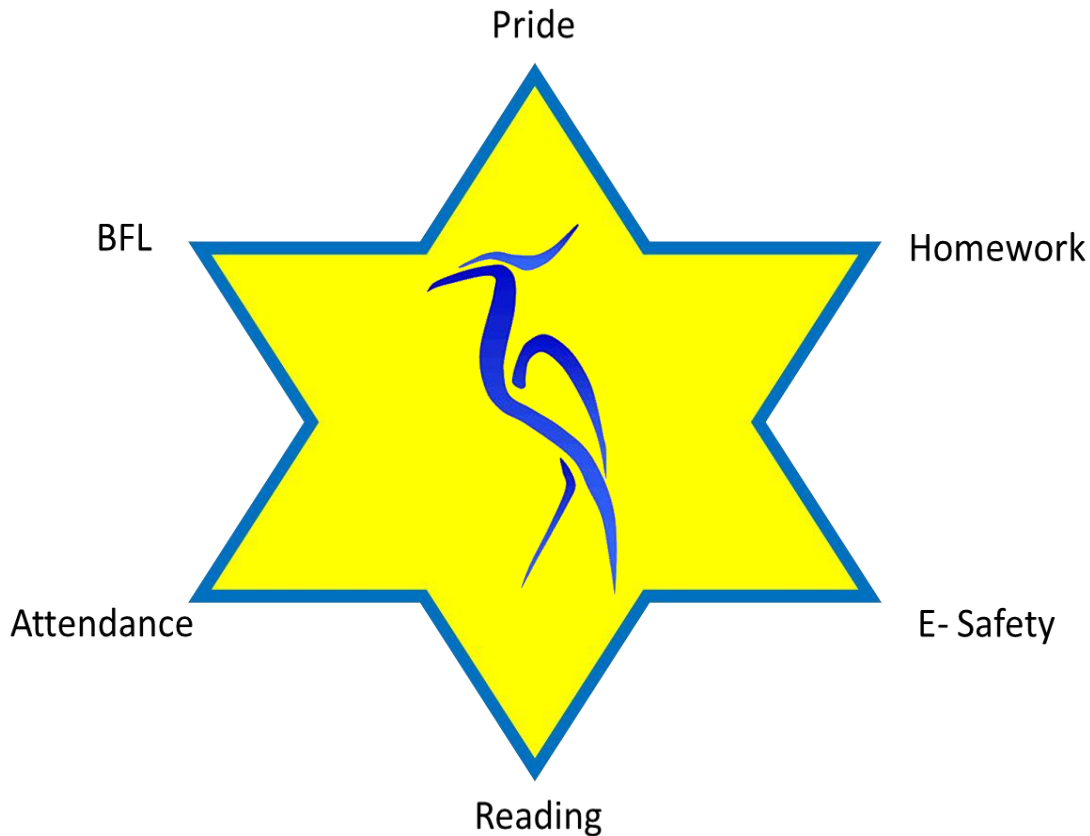

# Year 7 induction programme. Marshland Stars



Works on a point system where each student will be awarded a maximum of four points for each area.

Maximum total = 24

Need to have reached at least 14 points to have met the challenge.

Students with 21 points will be awarded the Marshland Super star

Students with less than 14 points will be a trainee star and need to work harder when completing the Marshland degree.
