Please note this Friday 24th October is a staff training day (INSET) meaning students' last day this half term is Thursday 23rd October, with everyone returning on Monday 3rd November.

Attendance

Please make sure that your child attends on the first day back after half term. You should not be using the first day back as an extended holiday. In line with statutory guidance from Norfolk County Council, holidays taken by families during term time will be classed as unauthorised absence and a referral to issue a fixed penalty notice processed.

Currently whole school attendance is 93.3%. Well done to year 7 who have 96% attendance.

The Government has a raised focus on attendance, which is being followed by the school, in an attempt to improve future achievement and prospects for young people.

Why Attendance Matters

Every day in school counts! Government research shows a clear link between good attendance, higher grades, and better future opportunities.

Pupils who attend regularly are more likely to achieve good GCSEs and go on to further study or training. Each day missed can mean falling behind in learning that's hard to catch up on later.

Good attendance builds confidence, supports friendships, and sets children up for long-term success. Let's work together to make sure every student is in school, on time, every day they are well enough to attend.

Uniform Reminder

Thank you to all those students who make an effort to abide by the school uniform guidance. However, every year a small number of students return to school after the holidays with false or painted nails, extreme haircuts, piercings, false eyelashes, trainers or general uniform issues. Please ensure that your child returns to school correctly dressed and ready to learn.

Please note we have updated our uniform guidance online to include the addition of white socks:

• 'Plain grey, black or white socks or plain grey, black or flesh-coloured tights (no over-knee socks or socks with tassels/bows)'

Bags should be of a practical use for the purposes of school. Every child should have a school bag with them every day including all their required equipment and a refillable water bottle. Sanctions will be issued for missing items.

Skirts should be worn just above the knee and must not be rolled at the waist to shorten the length. Skirts must also not be altered to make them shorter.
